



PE and Sport Grant Funding 2017 – 2018

2017-18 Funding

For 2017-18 academic year we will receive £9485 (though this is likely to increase) in PE and Sport Grant funding. This will allow us to continue to increase the participation of sporting activities after school and to build pupils' passion for sports.

Sports apprentice predicted costings – £8000

Even though child engagement and participation within sports has increased it is still a focus for us this academic year. Through the employment of a sports apprentice, we will be able to introduce more sports/games opportunities during play and lunch times. The role of the sports apprentice will be to target children who are reluctant in taking part within sports and introduce them to new/different physical activities.

As well as this, the sports apprentice will coordinate the schools chosen sports leaders (10 pupils within year 6) to develop their leadership within sport. The apprentice and sports leaders will work alongside each other to lead sports and games during play times to include as many children as possible.

The sports apprentice will also lead the school change for life club on Friday afternoons. This will involve targeting 12 children within key stage 2 who are most in need of extra confidence within sport or who display low self-esteem.

Training and CPD predicted costings - £500

Teaching staff and teaching assistants, who are involved in the delivery of PE attend training delivered by the Farringdon Community Sports College PE Sustainability Programme, a bought in CPD provider. The CPD package is targeted at all staff, focusing on a sports specific element to develop skills and knowledge for challenging yet achievable learning.

Community Links and competitions predicted costings- £1000

Farringdon Academy links with local comprehensive schools and primary schools to support and develop competitive sport. All Year groups are included in this timetable of activities. For example:

- Competitions for children to be involved and work together in
- Training from expert PE teachers
- Opportunities to take part in a wide range of sports
- Building relationships with other children through sports

Swimming predicted costings - £500

Swimming lessons are delivered by an expert swimming teacher. Swimming lessons are delivered to upper key stage 2 classes.

They focus on:

- Confidence in the water
- Learning to swim
- Developing swimming strokes

- Increasing swimming distances.

After school activities predicted costs - £850

The number of after-school activities has increased meaning a larger participation rate of children being able to access physical activities outside of the curriculum time. These include:

- Key Stage 2 Football
- Year 6 football team training
- Key Stage 2 Dance
- Key Stage 1 Dance
- Year 1 to 6 Multi skill
- Year 1 to 6 Performing arts

Participation rates are closely monitored by the PE coordinator and the PE link from Farringdon Community Academy for possibilities for further opportunities and year groups to allow Farringdon children to be active and to develop their coordination, movement and performance in a variety of activities.

Learning Opportunities

Learning opportunities for children are enriched using sport and healthy living as the core target. Professionals from throughout the community continue to work with children in a range of areas. These include workshops with the Newcastle Eagles and local health care workers such as the dentist and the school nurse.

Sports coaching predicted costs - £11000

This will provide us with the opportunity to employ specialist sports coaches to work alongside teachers to increase subject knowledge and skills. For example:-

- A qualified coach teaches high-quality football skill and expert games knowledge to year groups 1 to 6 throughout the year.
- A specialist coach works with the class teachers to deliver high quality gymnastics session. Developing children's performance and skills progression.
- A specialist coach teaches high-quality performing arts to year groups 1 to 6 throughout the year.
- Participation in the Hoops for Heath competition for Year 5 with Basketball coaching.
- Participation in the Sunderland Tennis competition for Year 3 and 4 with Tennis coaching.
