Science Teaching: Y6 Science focus includes living things and their habitats autumn 1 – which has a link to animals and living things missed in Y5 summer 2. The Y6 learning focus on classifying animals and plants. The missed learning is around life cycles and gestation periods of animals, which could be used when classifying animals.

In spring 2 Y6 don't have a science topic and materials which has been missed from summer 1 in Y5 can be covered then. In addition conductivity which is an element of the materials topic can be linked to the Y6 electricity topic in spring 2.

Other Foundation Subjects.

Directly Taught Foundation Subjects: Where a decision is made to teach a foundation subject discretely in afternoon lessons each week (i.e. History) – consider how the current year units (i.e. Y6 unit WW1) can be adapted to include the previous year's missed learning (comparing aspects of the past e.g. rich/poor and how the past has influenced life today).

Art in Y6 spring 2 is collage this can cover missed learning from Y5 collage that was missed in summer 1. Y6 Autumn 2 is textiles this can incorporate embroidery that was missed in Y5 summer 1.

Indirectly Taught Foundation Subjects: Where a decision is made that a specific foundation subject will NOT being taught discretely in afternoon lessons each week (i.e. Religious Education), then consider how the missed Y5 units and Y6 units could both be delivered through other subjects (i.e. In Year 6 this could mean reading comprehensions or art activities with focus on the topics of Muslims beliefs and Christianity). It is important to show that these subjects are still being accommodated elsewhere in the curriculum.
